


CLASSIC COMEBACK

Sweden's Magic Carpets

WONDROUS ROLLAKAN FLATWEAVES swept through the midcentury like a comet. Led by vanguards like Märta Måås-Fjetterström, whose Båstad textile workshop has been a hothouse for pushing artistic boundaries since the 1920s, modernists spun Anatolian and Oriental motifs into a new, native dialect-exceptional and intensely colorful within Scandinavia's already noteworthy weaving tradition. Today, the rugs re-emerge with remarkable range. Whispers of folk art blend with brilliant geometrics for a new class of kilims that transcend modernism.
